Placement procedures for entry to selective high schools in Year 7 in 2023

In this document 'selective' includes fully selective high schools, partially selective high schools and selective agricultural high schools as well as Aurora College, the virtual selective high school.

For students applying in 2021 for placement in 2023, primary schools are not required to provide school assessment scores for their applicants. Students' placement scores will be calculated based on their test scores. The placement score will be out of 120.

Information about placement is subject to change throughout 2022 because COVID-19 restrictions may affect timing and processes.

The role of the primary school

As primary principal, you are responsible for:

- advising parents of the opportunity to apply online and before the closing date. This includes
 advertising the dates and the Team's website link on the school's website and in at least two school
 newsletters or equivalent. Please consider placing a notice on your street-facing noticeboard while
 applications are available but remove it as soon as they close.
- ensuring that important school events such as school camps and athletics carnivals are not scheduled on the test day
- printing and distributing placement information booklets to parents who request it
- advising parents with no internet access to visit a public library to apply online or assisting them to apply at school if possible
- advising parents to contact the Team for assistance if they have a disability which means they are unable to use a computer
- supplying information about the applications on the principal's portal (government schools only)
- completing the principal's page for provision of information about the application and sending them to the Team (non-government schools only)
- consulting with the Team about reasonable adjustments for disability that are provided at school
- being prepared to allocate staff to support students with reasonable adjustments if required
- where there are high numbers of candidates, assigning a teacher to assist in marshalling of students to enter the test room
- if required by COVID-19 guidelines, being prepared to administer the test to students from the school who have applied
- commenting on appeals submitted if requested
- supporting families where students are found to have engaged in malpractice during the test.

Selective high schools

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students of high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability and by using specialised teaching methods.

Information about the placement process

Selection criteria, general procedures and an outline of the application process for the placement of students in Year 7 at selective high schools are contained on the Team's website https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes and in the 'Placement in selective high schools for Year 7 entry in 2023' information booklet and are not repeated in this document.

Providing advice to parents

Please advise all parents of Year 5 students that they can apply for selective high school placement in 2023. Please particularly encourage high potential and gifted Aboriginal students and students from low socio-economic backgrounds to apply.

Consult with parents if they ask you about the suitability of selective high school placement for their children, but be cautious about making predictions about a student's chances of selection.

Ensure that the opening and closing dates for applications and the Team's website are advertised at least twice in school newsletters, on the noticeboard, and on the school's website home page. Each year the Team receives complaints by parents who claim that the school did not inform them of the application process.

To assist you to identify students whose parents intend to apply, you may wish to use the optional 'Intention to apply' form for parents which is included at the back of this document. A digital version is available to government schools at: https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/general-information/resources-for-schools.

Ensure parents know that this Intention to apply form is **not an application**. It only informs the school which students are likely to need a reminder to apply by the due date.

Please direct parents to the Team's website to find updated information about placement, the printable booklet 'Placement in selective high schools for Year 7 entry in 2023', the application link and relevant forms.

Submitting an application

Parents must apply online via the link on the Team's website at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7/application-process. The online application form will open on 19 October 2021 and will close on 17 November 2021. Parents must apply by the due date.

When parents submit an online application they will receive an email confirming their application.

Parents must not make more than one application for the same child. If they find they have made a mistake after submitting the application they will be able to log into their application dashboard to make changes, receive and send messages and upload documents at a later date.

Parents who miss the due date may request approval to apply late for a limited time. Approval is granted only in serious and well documented extenuating circumstances. Where parents maintain that the school did not advise them of the dates for application they will be asked to request a supporting statement from the school. Please supply such a statement only if you have not advised parents in any way that applications were available.

Parents are asked NOT to send school reports to the Team unless requested to do so.

Parents without internet access

If parents do not have internet access they are advised to access computers at a public library but you may be able to assist by allowing access to school computers at a designated time. If parents have a disability and cannot use a computer, ask them to contact the Team for assistance. It is not possible to send or receive communication by post so all applicants will need to use email.

Parents who use public internet facilities need to:

- create a web-based email account such as Yahoo or Hotmail or Gmail
- go to the Team's website at: https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7 and open the link to the online application
- enter the new email address when registering to apply
- return to the email account to receive the password and link to log in to the application
- log in using the access key/password and complete the questions in the application
- submit the application
- All further communication will be sent by email as mail services are not available.

Reports to government schools

During the application period, government school principals will be able to access a SCOUT report to see which students have applied. Check the reports to ensure that applicants intending to apply have been listed. The final list of applicants will be available in the principal's portal when applications close.

Application processing by government school principals

The Team will send detailed instructions for submitting the information about all applications via an online principals' portal by 1 December 2021. These instructions will be sent around 17 November 2021.

Let the Team know about any listed students not enrolled in your school and about duplicate applications for the same student.

Application processing by non-government school principals

Non-government principals do not have access to the principal's portal. They are asked by parents to complete the principal's page for provision of information about the application and forward it to the Team at ssu@det.nsw.edu.au by 1 December 2021.

Testing of students

Details of the test format are available at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7/the-test along with practice questions. The test in 2022 is expected to be paper-based.

All candidates are required to take the Selective High School Placement Test. The test is usually conducted in test centres established in NSW government high schools. Invigilators are employed to administer the test in high school test centres.

If changes occur to testing and/or test centre arrangements, principals will be notified as soon as the changes are confirmed.

By 24 February 2022, all applicants will receive a 'Test authority' 'letter, information about the test and the test centre they have been allocated to. If parents have not received this letter by 4 March they should contact the Team. Government schools will be advised of their students' test centres.

Where a significant number of students from a primary school attend a test centre to sit the test, it would be greatly appreciated if the school could send a teacher along to assist with the marshalling of students before the test.

Parents of students sitting the test are responsible for making travel arrangements to and from the test centre. Students must arrive by 9:00am. The expected finishing time is 1:30pm.

Reasonable adjustments for disability

When a parent makes a request for reasonable adjustments for disability for the test, the Team may

contact the principal of the student's current primary school for information about adjustments made at school. Principals are also asked to add information about adjustments that are provided at school when they log into the principal's portal or complete the Principal's page (for non-government schools).

Where a student has a disability, including a medical or behavioural condition, requiring separate supervision in the test, the student's primary school may be asked to send an aide or other staff member to ensure that the student is always supervised by two staff members. Primary schools may be asked to provide a laptop computer for students who need to use a computer for the test.

Principals have an obligation to identify students who may pose a risk to other students or staff at a test centre. Principals do this by making a comment in the principal portal. The Team will arrange for separate supervision if necessary.

Preparing students for the test

The Selective High School Placement Test is a secure test and papers are unavailable for scrutiny before, during and immediately after the test session.

The Department does not endorse coaching for the Selective High School Placement Test as it is designed as a measure of academic ability or potential.

It would be helpful if students were familiar with test technique. If parents or staff members wish to familiarise students with the test, they could use the practice test papers available on the website https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7/the-test in order to:

- show students the test format
- provide the students with experience in multiple-choice testing
- ensure that the students understand how to record their answers on the appropriate answer sheets and that they must erase completely and show new answers clearly if they change their mind
- advise students to manage time and not to spend too much time on any single question
- encourage students to guess any answers they are uncertain about as marks are not taken off for wrong answers
- emphasise the importance of periodically checking the number of the question against the number of the answer to avoid misalignment, as misalignments cannot be compensated for

Practice with any other kind of multiple-choice questions could also help students become familiar with this kind of test.

The department has added robust measures to identify student malpractice. The consequence of malpractice can be that their scores are not considered and students are not eligible for placement in a selective high school. Advise students to make sure they don't look at or copy another student's answers or allow copying of their own answers.

Academic records

Parents are NOT required at the application stage to submit school reports, merit certificates, competition or test results such as NAPLAN, or evidence of achievements in sport or performing arts.

Parents may provide additional relevant supporting information such as:

- information about disability, medical or behavioural condition and the likely effect on the academic performance of students
- the results of individual IQ tests if requested
- Court Orders if they relate to decisions about the education of the student and communication with parents.

Parents are asked to give permission for NAPLAN and similar results to be accessed for additional information, if required.

All students are ranked and placed in order of academic merit. For placement in 2023, academic merit is based on the Selective High School Placement Test scores as no school assessment scores will be available. This is expressed as a calculated placement score out of 120.

If further evidence of academic merit is necessary, such as in the case of illness or misadventure causing the student to miss the test, the selection committee may approach the parents and/or school.

Acceleration

Parents of students currently in Year 4 should not be encouraged to apply to enter Year 7 in 2023 unless the school recommends acceleration. Parents may request a supporting letter to upload to their application.

Repetition

Parents of students who are in Year 6 in 2021 should be discouraged from applying unless there is a valid reason for them to repeat a school Year.

If parents insist, principals of government schools should note any details on the principal portal and non-government principals should note details on the Principal's page for provision of information about the application.

Selection committees have discretion not to place students who are apply when in Year 6 in 2021 and whose parents wish them to repeat Year 7 in a selective high school in 2023.

Reapplying

Parents may reapply but should be advised that the selection committee can consider whether or not students who took the Selective High School Placement Test in the previous year have gained undue benefit from their experience with the test. Parents can apply for placement starting in Years 8 to 12 if they miss out on a place for Year 7.

Enrolment policy

The NSW Department of Education has a responsibility to assess and manage any risk of harm to its staff or students. This includes assessing and managing risks posed to students or staff at a school by any student.

As principal, you have an obligation to identify any students who may pose a risk to students or staff both in a testing situation and if placed in a selective high school.

Selection committees

To streamline the selection process, the Team will make recommendations before the selection committee meetings. Selection committee meetings will then ratify those recommendations or change them, as appropriate.

All placement decisions will be made using the results of the Selective High School Placement Test and, where relevant, information provided by schools and information supplied by parents.

Placement outcome information

In early July the Team will send the placement outcome to parents. Parents must respond to offers, either accepting or declining. Parents of students found to have engaged in malpractice will receive the information just prior to all other outcomes being released.

Parents then have the opportunity to submit a Results enquiry or appeal via their application dashboard.

Government primary school principals will be sent an initial outcome report for the principal's reference only. This initial outcome report will be available shortly after individual placement outcome information is sent to parents. It is strictly confidential and the contents must not be discussed with anyone until after placement outcomes are released to parents.

The report will show all students who have received offers, those on reserve lists and those who have been unsuccessful.

Non-government primary schools can request a report listing the outcome for applicants for whom they have provided the principal's page and where parents have given permission.

The report may indicate that some students have been placed on 'hold', pending further investigation of matters such as residency status or social and emotional maturity in the case of those seeking accelerated progression.

These primary school outcome reports will be updated throughout the year on request. Please check all information on them and notify the Team, as quickly as possible, of any changes or errors.

Selective high school placement process for placement in Year 7 in 2023

Applications for Year 7 entry to selective high schools in 2023 are now open. Applications will close on 17 November 2021.

All applicants are required to sit the Selective High School Placement Test to be held on Thursday 10 March 2022.

The application dashboard system enables parents to log in to make updates and add attachments even after an application is submitted. Parents can also communicate directly with the High Performing Students Team through the system's 'messages' feature.

The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 10 March 2022.

Applications open on 19 October 2021 and close on 17 November 2021. You must apply before the closing date.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.
